Support Goal Surpassed

To date 106 non-profit organizations have officially expressed support for creating the Julius Rosenwald & Rosenwald Schools National Historical Park, surpassing the ambitious goal of 100 set in January for the year, when only 41 organizations had signed on.

The organizations represent a robust and diverse range of constituencies, including National Parks and historic preservation groups; museums; churches and synagogues; Black and Jewish organizations; and support groups for twelve Rosenwald Schools.

Several of those groups have acquired the support of at least five other organizations near their schools.

“The Campaign is extremely proud of this and its other accomplishments in 2021, which move us closer to the creation of the National Park” said President Dorothy Canter, who pledged that the goal for 2022 will be at least 160 organizations.

The Campaign deeply appreciates all the organizations that have signed on in support of creating the Park and especially the individuals who made that support a reality.
